## Dear GSA Councilors,

I am writing to provide you with an update on early December news, as the Vice-President Finance and Operations.

## 1) Fall 2024 GSA-CGPS Need-Based Bursary Deadline Extended

Due to lack of availability of the Bursary Selection Committee to meet, the deadline for the Fall Need-Based Bursary was extended to December 8. The committee met on December 18 to review applications, and successful applicants will be contacted on December 19. Bursaries will be distributed electronically before the new year.

## 2) UPass Opt-Out

The UPass opt-out application is now open through January 17, 2025. Students who are eligible to opt out should fill out the application as soon as possible. Students must opt out every term. GSA has received student feedback that the opt-out criteria is not representative of student needs, and we are in discussions with SaskTransit and USSU about possible changes. We want to clarify that GSA does not exclusively control these criteria, but these are resultant from a long-standing agreement between GSA, USSU, and SaskTransit which may not be easy to change rapidly without major agreement renegotiations.

## Future strategies and things to continue working on:

My thanks goes to Nickson, the VPAS, for organizing the Diversity Committee's first beginnings of a meeting this academic year. We will meet in January sometime.

Organizing respectful Indigenous representation at the 2025 GSA Gala. I have learned from the mistakes of previous years and intend to ensure that the GSA upholds its commitments to the First Peoples of this area in all its doings.

Work continues on building and maintaining relationships with the groups on campus, and I have set up connections with the Provost's office as well as the (very small!) Jewish community that we have here.

Daycare: Unfortunately, there has been little progress. Finding funding for a daycare on campus is entirely a full time job in researching funding needs and writing grant applications, as well as coordinating with government entities on what they need to see from the resources we have available. The GSA does not have those resources, but the federal government does.

Anti-racism authority initiative update: the USSU is drafting a full report on the general needs of students who are facing difficulty in academic work or who are in a personal crisis. It is also assessing those needs in terms of what the University is offering in answer to those needs. My idea for a middle way to address racism on campus kind of got folded into a bigger call for an authority on campus that mediates issues. This will have to be separate from the advocacy bodies that the GSA and USSU were originally meant to be- and because this is a small part of a bigger issue, fixing my small issue alone will not be as effective as fixing the gap in university infrastructure. Fixing that bigger gap is hard to do and must be done with care, and as such, progress is slow.
