e. Resignation of the Vice-President External

- The president, Palash Roy, informed the council about the resignation of the VP External, Biraj Saha, after 7 months of service with immediate effect on December 1st, 2025.
- Resignation was based on conflicting schedules.
- Suny Bui was recommended by the executives to be appointed as the new VP External due to time constraints and the inability to conduct a By-election.

f. Motion 2: To Appoint SUNNY BUI as Vice-President External Affairs

- Sunny Bui won the election with 14 votes as the new GSA Vice-President External Affairs.

g. GSA Executives Reports

➤ **President – Palash Roy**

- The USSU has agreed to manage the spring-summer transit pass for graduate students on behalf of the GSA, with the option to opt out.
 - ❖ In view of this, the GSA hopes to communicate to graduate students in due time about the cost and duration of the transit pass.
- The president recognized the effort of Lindsay, the VP Finance, for the successful annual audit of the current fiscal year and the proper maintenance of records through her years of service in the GSA.
 - ❖ The GSA, through its banking partner, RBC, is seeking to engage in short-term and low-risk investment options with a proposed start date in January 2026.
- The GSA, in discussion with the President's Executive Committee, aims to organize EDI toolkits for the campus community.

- The GSA, in collaboration with Student Health and Wellbeing, the Sustainability Committee, the International Students and Study Abroad Centre, and the University of Saskatchewan Students' Union, will host the annual Holiday Hangout for students.

➤ **Vice-President Finance and Operations – Lindsay Carlson**

- The GSA annual audit has been completed for the year 2025.
 - ❖ Details of the financial report will be posted on the GSA website.
 - ❖ Continuation of audit service with Buckberger Baerg & Partners LLP.
- The GSA's organized low-cost professional portrait was successful with 67 students in attendance.
- VP Finance voted on the following issues:
 - ❖ Against the proposed increase of fees regarding late registration, late payment of tuition, and rescheduling of final examinations in the fee review committee.
 - ❖ Balance of international and domestic students to the national NSERC competition within the scholarship and awards committee.

➤ **Vice-President Student and Academic Affairs - Mandela Alema**

- The annual Holiday Hangout will be organized for students by the GSA in collaboration with the USSU, ISSAC, Office of Sustainability and Student Wellness Centre from the 29th - 30th of December 2025.
- The GSA is set to launch an intramural sports team in the Winter 2026 with the aim to encourage students' well-being and social involvement.
 - ❖ The sport activity will begin with basketball, volleyball, and futsal (indoor soccer).

EXECUTIVE REPORTS

President:

Dear GSA Councilors,

I am pleased to provide you with an update on my activities as President over the months of December and January. Below, I highlight recent initiatives, accomplishments, and our upcoming priorities.

GSA Transit Pass

Since our last update, we have continued our efforts to engage with transit services, though progress has been slower during the holiday period. We've managed to establish communication and are scheduled for another meeting regarding potential changes to our fees and the possibility of holding a referendum to add a spring/summer bus pass. If the referendum passes, we expect the spring/summer pass to be available to graduate students starting in spring 2027. We will continue to keep you updated as we move forward with this process.

GSA Childcare Initiative

Thanks to the support of CGPS, we have secured CAD 1,000 to develop a childcare business proposal, a much-needed initiative. We are currently in discussions with the Interim Vice Provost of Students and Learning to determine how best to utilize this funding. Our plan is to collaborate with the Edwards School of Business to develop a comprehensive proposal and offer honoraria to those involved in the process. We aim to have the proposal finalized in the coming months.

GSA & Education Minister Everett Hindle

We continue to work on scheduling a meeting with our provincial Education Minister, Everett Hindle, to discuss the challenges faced by graduate students in Saskatchewan, including issues surrounding childcare. We are awaiting confirmation and will keep you updated on the outcome of this important conversation.

GSA Discussion about Alumni Email in PEC

During our recent meeting with the University President's Executive Committee (PEC), we discussed the future of the alumni email service. While we advocated for the retention of this service, it was determined that the project is financially unsustainable, as fewer than 5% of alumni actively use their UofS email addresses. However, alumni will still have the option to pay a minimal fee if they wish to retain their email address. Going forward, the university will notify graduating students nearly a year in advance to allow ample time to transition to a different email address.

GSA Advocacy for International Mother Language Day

In alignment with our Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion initiatives, GSA is advocating for the recognition of International Mother Language Day on campus. Given the linguistic diversity at UofS and the ongoing loss of many languages, we believe this would be a meaningful initiative to celebrate. We are

currently in discussions with the Deputy Provost's office, the Language Centre, and CGPS. I welcome any suggestions from council members on how the university can best celebrate this day and further promote linguistic diversity.

Iranian Students and the Current Situation

Many of you are aware of the current situation in Iran. On January 12th, GSA released a statement of solidarity, and on January 20th, we hosted an event specifically for Iranian students. This event, organized in collaboration with Student Health & Wellness, UofS Student Affairs and Outreach, and ISSAC, provided a platform for Iranian students to share their experiences and challenges. GSA, together with the University, is actively working to support Iranian students during this difficult time. While discussions with senior university leaders are ongoing, we will provide further information as soon as we have confirmed details.

GSA Investments

I am pleased to officially announce that GSA is moving forward with investing its funds in low-risk investments, specifically in the form of Guaranteed Investment Certificates (GICs). Our VP Finance, Lindsay, has been working diligently to finalize these arrangements, and I want to commend her for her exceptional efforts. She is doing an outstanding job managing this process, and I am confident that this will benefit the GSA in the long term. For more details, please refer to Lindsay's report.

GSA Fees (Health & Dental, GSA Fees)

I would like to inform you that there will be a 5% increase in the Health & Dental fees for the upcoming period. Additionally, we will need to adjust the GSA fees to reflect how students are utilizing our services. The increase in GSA fees will be modest, just over 1 CAD. This adjustment is necessary to ensure we can continue to support essential services and meet the growing needs of our members. VP Finance, Lindsay, will provide further details on these adjustments during her presentation.

GSA Holiday Hangout

One of our flagship events, the GSA Holiday Hangout, was held over two days and was both successful and well-attended. While the numbers listed on paper represent only a portion of the attendees, we were able to accommodate even more participants than anticipated. This success would not have been possible without the collaboration of our campus partners, including the Office of the Provost, Student Health & Wellness, USSU, Office of Sustainability, and ISSAC. A special thank you to Mandela and all the volunteers who contributed to the event's success. Further details can be found in the VP Academic Mandela's report.

GSA OPUS Session during Welcome Week

In collaboration with OPUS, GSA hosted a short welcoming session for new and returning students. The session focused on how students can turn their research into business ideas, showcasing the opportunities available through UofS OPUS. It was a great opportunity to engage with students and introduce them to our services.

GSA Indigenous Intercultural Exchange & Resource Fair

For the first time, under the leadership of our VP Indigenous, we hosted a remarkable event focused

on learning about Indigenous culture. I would also like to commend Laila for securing sponsorship for the event, ensuring that no GSA budget was used for this initiative, an excellent example of leadership and innovation. Kudos to Laila for her hard work in organizing this successful event. Further details are available in her report.

Dear GSA Councilors,

Happy New Year! Please find below an update on my January activities as the Vice-President Finance and Operations.

1) Health and Dental Plan Renewal

The GSA Executives met with our Studentcare representatives in December to review claim trends from last year's plan, then again in January to discuss renewal costs. Usask requires GSA to submit fees for the next academic year (2026-2027) in January or February of the current year. Because of this deadline, Studentcare must estimate what GSA's plan cost will be for the following year based on only three months (September – November) of plan use data. The GSA Executives will continue to work with Studentcare representatives to fully understand drivers of plan cost increases, and work to maintain a balance of excellent benefits and affordability for graduate students. GSA must submit our 2026-2027 fees for review by the fee review committee by February 2.

2) Upcoming financial literacy events

I am working to plan two financial literacy events for the winter term, including a virtual information session on saving and investing, as well as an in-person session focused on answering tax filing questions for graduate students. Details will be announced soon.

3) Winter 2026 GSA-CGPS need-based bursary announced

The GSA-CGPS need-based bursary for winter term will open on February 2 and close February 20. Further details will be sent to all graduate students via email next week.

Affairs for late December and January, highlighting recent initiatives and accomplishments.

2025 Holiday Hangout

As part of student-focused initiatives under my portfolio to strengthen social connections among USask students and their families staying in Saskatoon over the winter break, the GSA in partnership with the USSU, ISSAC, Office of Sustainability and Student Wellness Centre hosted the 2025 Holiday Hangout on December 29 – 30, 2025. Dear GSA Council,

I am writing to report on my activity for the month of December 2025 and January 2026

VP External Vote at December 2025 Council Meeting

I assumed the role of VP External of the GSA on January 1, 2026. Thank you for your unanimous vote for this position on the GSA from the council meeting that occurred Wednesday December 17th 2025.

Holiday Hangout

On December 29 and 30, I supported the GSA team in hosting this event at GSA Commons. I provided support on hand and ensure GSA visibility. The event was well attended and well received.

GSA Awards and GSA Gala

The awards are live now for students to register. The deadline for nominee applications is March 13th and the Awards Gala will occur on Saturday April 25th at TCU place. This year, each category will have two to three finalists, all being invited to the gala, where the winner will be announced for the award.

We have been seeking out venues and negotiating different options with various venues across Saskatoon such as The Holiday Inn (Downtown, University), Sheraton Cavalier, Delta, Besborough, Hilton Garden Inn, Marquis, to include a few. TCU place was the one that fit our date and pricing the most. It is my intent is to restore the prestigiousness of this event by adding some entertainment and marketing it to graduate students in creative ways.

GSA Childcare Initiative

Prior to the new year, I sent follow-up emails to Minister Everett Hindley and the Hon. Buckley Belanger from an email sent from my predecessor. Minister Hindley has agreed to meet with us on this initiative. We are waiting for the Hon. Buckley Belanger to confirm and respond. They had responded to the initial email that was sent, not the follow up.

Administrative & Support

Since being voted in at the December 2025 council meeting, I received email access promptly so I could begin to become acquainted with the position as there was no transition report left from previous VP external candidates. My priority was to gain access to all the social media accounts; Facebook, Instagram, Twitter were all recovered and a Threads account was created. Next, I was to understand the level of completion from my predecessor and begin sifting through emails. I followed up on the childcare initiative emails before the new year. After that, I began working on updating the GSA Awards and Gala for the current year.

I aided the VP Indigenous in some preparation for the Indigenous Resource Fair and Intercultural

Exchange. I provided some promotional support for the team via social media advertising the VP Indigneous's events and events forwarded to me by the executive such as the Opus I2B event and Iranian Support Space.
