

AWARDS INTRODUCTION

The Graduate Student Awards Gala is held once a year to honour the excellent graduate students and this is the 2nd Annual Gala. The awards are introduced by the category below.

Excellence in Aboriginal Research

This award honours a graduate student that has made significant impacts in his/her field of study and the research positively contribute to the Aboriginal community.

Research Excellence in the Humanities, Arts, Social Sciences, Law or Education

This award honours a graduate student that has made significant impacts in the field of humanities, arts, social sciences, law or education and has produced outstanding research results throughout their course of study.

Research Excellence in the Sciences

This award honours a graduate student that has made significant impacts in the field of science and has produced outstanding research results throughout their course of study.

Professional Excellence

This award honours a graduate student (non-thesis based program) that has made significant academic achievement in his or her field of study and has made outstanding non-academic contributions to his or her department of studies.

Interdisciplinary Research Excellence

This award honours a graduate student that has made significant impacts in two separate but related fields of study and has produced outstanding research results throughout their course of study.

Advising Excellence

This award honours a graduate student advisor that has shown excellent supervisory and mentoring skills as well as exceptional support for their students' ideas, scholarly works, and financial needs.

Excellence in Community Service

This award honours a graduate student that has made significant impacts and positively contributes to the local community of Saskatoon.

Exceptional Course Councillor Award

This award honours a course councillor of the GSA that has shown exceptional initiative beyond their call of duty to carry out the mission of the GSA.

Outstanding Past GSA Executive

This award honours a past GSA Executive graduate student that has made significant contributions to the GSA. The current GSA Executive appreciates their dedication and hard work.

Outstanding GSA Partner Award

This award honours a special partner of the GSA and as a result of the partnership has made significant contributions to graduate students on campus. The current GSA Executive appreciates their dedication and support of our work.

Excellence in Aboriginal Research - Janna Schurer

Janna Schurer is a PhD student in the Department of Veterinary Microbiology. She has served as an ambassador and advocate for the University in environments ranging from national science conferences to stakeholder meetings in local indigenous communities. To exemplify her extraordinary abilities to build positive collaborations, Janna has worked closely with Indigenous communities in Saskatchewan, including Dene, Cree, Saulteaux and Ojibway communities. Her research is providing a foundation for these communities to develop local, culturally appropriate, and effective interventions to reduce the health risks posed by parasites and free-ranging dogs.



Research Excellence in the Humanities, Arts, Social Sciences, Law or Education - Rim Lassoued

Rim Lassoued is a PhD student in the Department of Bioresource Policy, Business and Economics. Her research focuses on consumer confidence in food attributes, particularly providing a clearer understanding of the concept of public trust that should be of relevance for policy makers and the food industry. Rim had been communicating her research findings and contribution in a number of national and international conferences. In 2001, Rim won the 3rd prize when participating at the 1st Annual Canadian Agricultural Policy Conference in Ottawa. Furthermore, some of her work has been published in the top agricultural journals.



Research Excellence in the Sciences - Abdallah Karoyo

Abdallah Karoyo is a PhD student in the Department of Chemistry. He has carried out pioneering work on the structure and function of supramolecular materials using novel solid-state NMR methodologies. Such materials have potential application in adsorption processes in drug delivery, separation and interfacial phenomena and 'smart materials' technology. Abdallah's research work has produced important novel findings that have led to several high quality publications in top shelf physical chemistry journals, which to address major knowledge gaps in this field. He presented his research at various local, national and international (Europe & USA) conferences.



Professional Excellence - Mengna Lu

Mengna Lu is a graduate student in the Department of Environment Engineering. She quickly embarked on knowing her community by volunteering. Mengna volunteered for the career expo held by the Student Employment & Career Center (SECC) in the university. Likewise, she has volunteered for other numerous industries as a way of honing her networking skills. In study, she is always willing to take on difficult projects like Numerical Modeling in Environmental Engineering and Science. Mengna balanced the laboratory work, the teacher assistance work, and her studies through proper time management and planning processes. She also projects a warm, cheerful attitude to her fellow students and those she come into contact.



Interdisciplinary Research Excellence - Albert Ifeanyi Ugochukwu

Albert is a PhD student in the Department of Bio-resource Policy, Business and Economics. He is an enthusiastic scholar who loves what he does, and also always willing to share what he finds interesting should it be academic, social life, or world issues. Albert has worked in the areas of rural development, agricultural marketing, production value chain, and food safety. Besides, he has



carried out research in various disciplines across Africa, Europe and North America. Albert is a member of several professional associations and has attended several conferences around the world where he presented his research papers.

Advising Excellence - Nazmi Sari

Nazmi Sari is a professor in the Department of Economics. Since 2004, Prof. Sari accepted a position at the Department of Economics. He is known for his excellent supervising and mentoring skills. When Prof. Sari interacts with graduate students, he combines patient guidance with a commitment to excellent. He gives students the latitude to explore their own ideas but also guides them toward rigorous academic methods and profes-



sional standards. Sari's students are well trained for a professional career. They are easily employed upon graduation as they are well equipped with a deep knowledge of Health Economics.

Excellence in Community Service - Sarah Crawford

Sarah Crawford is a PhD student in the Toxicology Graduate Program. Sarah is also always willing to go beyond the hard work and long hours related to her thesis research and do other things that benefit the graduate program, the university community, the wider community in Saskatoon, and in her case community service at the national and international levels. Sarah initiated a local chapter of the global Café Scientifique, called “Tox on Tap”. She has been closely involved in the recently established Prairie Northern Regional chapter of the Society of Environmental Toxicology and Chemistry (SETAC), a global non-profit society. Meanwhile, Sarah has been an extremely active participant in the Toxicology Graduate Student Association.



Exceptional Course Councillor Award - Cinnati Loi

Cinnati Loi is the PhD student in the Department of Electrical and Computer Engineering and the president of the Engineering Graduate Course Council (EGCC). He initiated the reformation of the EGCC in 2012, after a period of inactivity for the group that lasted over two years. He sought out academic councillors from all nine disciplines of engineering to form the EGCC. Cinnati has created numerous, tangible improvements to student life for the graduate students of the College of Engineering. He was actively involved in organizing much-needed renovations to the engineering graduate student lounge, securing \$50,000 in funding from the College and university for this purpose. Cinnati has also worked as a key in establishing a clear link and presence of engineering graduates students with the GSA.



Outstanding Past GSA Executive - Nicole Callihoo

Nicole Callihoo is a graduate student at the Johnson Shoyoma Graduate School of Public Policy currently enrolled in the Master of Public Administration program. Raised in Alberta and a proud member of Paul First Nation, with a BA in Native Studies from the University of Alberta, she has over 15 years work experience with Friendship Centres across Canada and at all levels. She was the 2012-2013 Chair of the Aboriginal & Indigenous Graduate Student Council and the past Aboriginal Liaison for the Graduate Student Association. Her work with the GSA Executive resulted in the first GSA Awards Gala and creation of the Legacy Fund.




Outstanding GSA Partner - Alumni Association

Since that time he has championed a highly collaborative strategic planning process designed to define and advance the strategic direction of UPEI and support its academic mission—teaching, research and service.



Dr. Abd-El-Aziz has delivered over 160 presentations, and has chaired several international conferences including the International Congress on Advanced Materials held in China in 2011 and 2013. He has been invited to present lectures nationally and internationally. During the course of his career, Dr. Abd-El-Aziz has secured research funding totalling over \$10,000,000.

An accomplished chemist and fellow of the Chemical Institute of Canada, Dr. Abd-El-Aziz received his BSc and MSc degrees from Ain Shams University in Cairo, Egypt, his PhD from the University of Saskatchewan.


