#### Items for Action/Discussion:

• Eligibility as a full-time time work (Graduate Programs and Internationalization Specialist) for grad students

Sristy: A Ph.D. student would like to apply for a full-time position job in the university, is it possible based on the new law?

Mostafa: If the student is a full-time student, they cannot get the position. But part-time students have the opportunity.

• Leftover swag bags

The leftover bags, about 100 bags, are enough to circulate for winter new students, no need to prepare new ones.

• Meeting update with student wellness center manager (October 31, 2022)

Mostafa: The meeting was requested in July but because of her busy schedule we met this week. By comparing the number of doctors, nurses, and other staff before and after covid 19 with the manager. We tried to find out what is the problem with the long waiting time in the wellness center. The current waiting time to visit a doctor is 3 weeks.

The number of staff since 2015 has been constant, but the number of students increased by about 3000.

• Graduate Research Conference (determining schedule)

Funding of 3000\$ is requested from CGPS to hold the graduate research conference. There is enough budget to include prizes for the winners and announce them to encourage students to participate.

#### GSA President's Report (December 2022-January 2023) to GSA Council Members

Dear GSA Council Members,

Please find the GSA President's monthly activity summary from December 2, 2022, to January 5, 2023, as listed below in order of importance of the activities.

#### 1. GSA Holiday Hangout Event (December 28, 2022)

The GSA organized a very successful holiday hangout event on December 28, 2022. The GSA sends an open invitation to all graduate students' visa GSA newsletter and via standalone email announcement. The event was attended by 250 graduate students. Because of 99 occupancy limits at a time at the GSA commons, the event was split into two sessions: 1) 10 am to 2 pm and 2) 3 pm to 8 pm. Snacks, lunch, and dinner were provided among all graduate students. Students participated in many indoor games, including Uno, monopoly, dart board, carom, etc. Students highly appreciate the event and sincerely requested to continue organizing the Holiday Hangout event during the long holiday break of Christmas and New Year.

#### 2. GSA Organized World Cup Football Match Watch Party (December 18, 2022)

The GSA organized World Cup Football Match Watch Party for graduate students on December 18, 2022. The party was well attended by graduate students. Morning breakfasts were served to all attendees. The event was only open to graduate students.

#### 3. Governance Committee Meeting (December 6, 2022)

The GSA president attended the Governance Committee Meeting and discussed policies about voting right (currently no voting right) of Executive Directors of the School of Public Health, School of Environment and Sustainability, and Johnson Shoyama School of Public Policy at the University of Saskatchewan Council. It is to be noted that neither the GSA president nor

the USSU president is a voting member of the governance committee. Thus, both student leaders asked the committee for voting right at the committee.

# 4. Strategic Priorities Steering Committee (December 7, 2022)

The GSA president attended the University's Strategic Priorities Steering Committee to discuss the University of Saskatchewan's research and development priorities.

#### 5. CFS Saskatchewan Chapter Meeting (December 7, 2022)

The GSA president attended the Canadian Federation of Students' Saskatchewan Chapter reintroduction meeting along with the University of Regina and First Nations University student leaders. The student leaders agreed to restart the provincial chapter of the CFS. University of Regina Student Union is assigned to prepare a constitution draft in winter 2023.

#### 6. PEC/Student Executives monthly meeting (December 8, 2022)

GSA executives meet the university leaders and discuss internet disruption issues at many residences building. The Vice Provost of Services, Greg Fowler, promised to resolve the issue with top priorities.

#### 7. CGPS Executive & Coordinating Committee Meeting (December 8, 2022)

The GSA president updated the committee about GSA activities and Fall bursaries. The GSA president informed the committee that the GSA awarded 35 need-based bursaries in the Fall of 2022, 120 applicants.

#### 8. Black History Month Planning (December 8, 2022)

The GSA president and VP of Academic and Student Affairs attended a meeting to discuss GSA's plan and to hear University's plan to organize Black History Month in February 2023. Another follow-up meeting is scheduled on January 16, 2023, to finalize event details.

#### 9. GSA Council Meeting (December 8, 2022)

The GSA president attended the GSA council meeting at the GSA commons, presented his report, and answered questions from council members.

#### 10. Residence Discussion #2 – GSA (December 12, 2022)

The GSA president and VP of student affairs attended a meeting with the university residence manager and his team members. Many important issues were discussed, including an additional fee charged for advance move-in at the University residence building during the Fall term. The GSA executives also discussed the SOURIS hall building liaison officer, playroom opening, kids' play session opening, and kids' immunization facility opening at the SOURIS hall building.

#### 11. GSA and PAWS (December 12, 2022)

The GSA president attended a meeting with University's communication department to discuss the communication strategies following the GSA manager's departure. University's communication department agreed to extend its helping hand until GSA hires a new manager.

#### 12. ThinkGrad Meeting (December 15, 2022)

The GSA president attended the ThinkGrad forum meeting. It is to be noted that ThinkGrad has been dormant since the pandemic started. The member agreed to re-activate the forum and work towards making a positive change to graduate students' life and well-being.

#### 13. University Council Meeting (Council Monthly Meeting)

The GSA president and VP of student affairs attended the university council meeting. President presented the GSA activity report. The GSA president asked University President about University's plan to reduce seasonal flu. Further, the GSA president asked University President about University's initiative to reduce the homicide rate among Saskatchewan's Indigenous people (the highest in Canada).

#### 14. GSA Gala Planning Meeting (December 16, 2022)

The GSA president attended a meeting with the GSA Gala Night 2023 event management team to discuss the details of the event, along with the VP of Finance and former GSA office manager. The GSA Gala night is scheduled on April 29, 2023, at the Remi Modern Hall. Approximately 200 guests will attend the Gala night. This will be the first in-person GALA night since 2019.

#### 15. Meeting with GSA Executive re: Tuition 2023-24 (December 19, 2022)

The University administration meets the GSA executive to inform them that University will follow its earlier Tuition fee increase. The dean of CGPS invites all graduate students to attend the Graduate Student 2023 Tuition Discussion on Monday, January 16<sup>th</sup>, 3–5 pm (CST) at ARTS 200 (Arts building room 200).

#### Report from the VP Finance and Operations (December 2022)

Hello GSA Councilors,

I am pleased to provide you an update on my activities as the current Vice-President Finance and Operations.

#### 1. GSA Summer Bursary Update

GSA bursary committee selected 35 applicants. We had a 20% growth comparing last year. We have been trying to increase the amount of the bursary by receiving more contribution from university and donations.

#### 2. GSA Commons and GSA operations

GSA has been working fully functional with serving graduate students. The GSA commons has been open to students as an amazing study space. We also accommodate events as a source of income for the GSA.

GSA recently released ratified clubs founds. We will serve other clubs as soon as they finish their ratification process.

Our office manager resigned this month by a very short notice so we used GSA coordinators to get trained by the outgoing office manager so they can serve as temporary office manager while the process of hiring a new office manager is happening.


